

TOP 25 WAYS TO INCORPORATE CHOICE IN LEARNING BECAUSE...CHOICE IS THE FRIEND OF INCLUSION



1. STANDING DESKS

Allows students to choose to stand while working, promoting movement and engagement.

2. GRAFFITI STYLE

Encourages creativity by letting students express their ideas in a visually dynamic manner.

3. SEATED: COUCH, STOOLS, YOGA BALLS, BEANBAGS, RECLINER

Offers a variety of seating options to enhance comfort and focus.

4. MICHAEL ANGELO STYLE UNDER A TABLE OR DESK

Engages students in a unique way by having them work on the underside of a table or desk, similar to Michelangelo painting the Sistine Chapel.

11. INTEREST-BASED GROUPS

Forms groups based on shared interests, enhancing engagement and collaboration.

12. WALK AND TALK

Combines physical movement with discussion, which can stimulate thinking and idea generation.

13. ROLE-PLAY OR TABLEAUX

Uses drama techniques to help students understand and internalize content through active participation.

14. TREASURE/SCAVENGER HUNTS

Turns learning into an interactive and exciting adventure, promoting problem-solving and teamwork.

15. MINI-TRAMPOLINE

Provides a fun and energetic way for students to take short movement breaks and re-energize.

16. LITERATURE CIRCLES

Facilitates in-depth discussion and analysis of texts in small groups, encouraging collaborative learning.

17. ALTERNATIVES TO TEXT

Offers different formats for reading material, catering to various learning preferences.

18. PROJECT-BASED LEARNING

Engages students in real-world projects that require critical thinking, collaboration, and problem-solving.

19. REAL WORLD APPLICATION

Connects learning to practical, real-world scenarios, making it more relevant and meaningful.

20. USE PERSONAL INTERESTS

Encourages students to write about topics they are passionate about, enhancing motivation and engagement.

21. EXTENSION- SELECT ONE ASPECT TO GO DEEPER

Allows students to delve deeper into a topic of interest, promoting advanced learning.

22. CHOICE IN SOLO OR COLLABORATIVE

Gives students the option to work independently or with peers, catering to different learning styles and preferences.

23. CHOICE “IN-REAL LIFE” VS VIRTUAL LEARNING

Provides flexibility in how students engage with content, whether through in-person or online methods.

24. VERBALLY

Offers various verbal expression options, accommodating different communication styles.

25. NON-VERBALLY

Provides multiple non-verbal ways for students to express their understanding and creativity.
